Welcome Message from the Convenor of the ECPR Standing Group on the European Union

Knud Erik Jørgensen

While the Treaty of Rome can soon be celebrated for its 50 years anniversary, Turkey and them European Union can soon celebrate their 44 years old association agreement. In this sense, Turkey has been along the process of European integration almost all the time, yet has not been considered a candidate state until relatively recent. Currently, Turkey is for better or worse as high on the European political agenda as an issue can get. As a reflection of the rapprochement between Turkey and the European Union, Turkish universities have created or strengthened their centres for EU studies, not least in the greater Istanbul area. Though we are meeting in Istanbul, Europe's biggest city, the conference is not solely about relations between the European Union and Turkey. As our previous conferences, the Third Pan-European Conference on EU Politics is about all aspects of EU politics. This said, the fact that we are meeting in Istanbul will probably provide certain (novel) perspectives on things. When discussing at panels and roundtables, the Turkish dimension is likely to be more present than if we had been meeting in Central or Western Europe. When we discuss European issues during the informal hours of the conference, i.e., when we sip tea, ayran or other drinks at cafes around Taksim Square or elsewhere, the context will matter. At least, such expectations were among the reasons to organize the conference in Istanbul.

If it is confession time, let me just admit that four years ago I had never attended an academic meeting in Istanbul or in Turkey for that matter. Sure, I had enjoyed several vacations in the country, but no academic exchanges and I had limited knowledge of Turkish colleagues or their work. I cannot know for sure but I think that for many participants this conference will be an academic *prima volta* experience. Indeed, one of the prime functions of a conference like this one is to exchange ideas, to communicate findings, to learn from each other and to establish or strengthen networks. I hope that the mixture of stimulating panels, challenging plenary meetings, lively roundtables and social receptions will be instrumental to achieving our endeavours. In this regard, it is very satisfying to note how publications with birthmarks from our two first Pan-European Conferences increasingly emerge in journals and books.

A conference like the Third Pan-European Conference on EU Politics is fully dependent on highly committed people who are ready to do the kind of work that takes time away from research and does not count in publication statistics. I would like to thank the programme chair, Frank Schimmelfennig, for his readiness to take on a huge burden and his devotion to prepare an attractive and inspiring conference programme. In the same context, I would like to thank the eight section chairs for their crucially important role in accepting, rejecting and, generally, organizing the programme. I would also like to thank Ole Elgström, Erik Jones and Meltem Müftüler-Baç who are members of the SGEU Organizing Committee and among the initiators of the conference. Finally, I am most grateful to Istanbul Bilgi University for hosting the conference and to the Bilgi team, i.e., Senem Aydın, Ayhan Kaya, Sule Kut and Özge Onursal for taking meticulous care of big issues and smaller yet most important details.

In his essay, *Flight from Byzantium*, the Russian poet Joseph Brodsky describes how a temporary touch down in Istanbul had an enduring effect on his reflections. Presumably we will experience something similar. I look forward to meeting you in Istanbul!

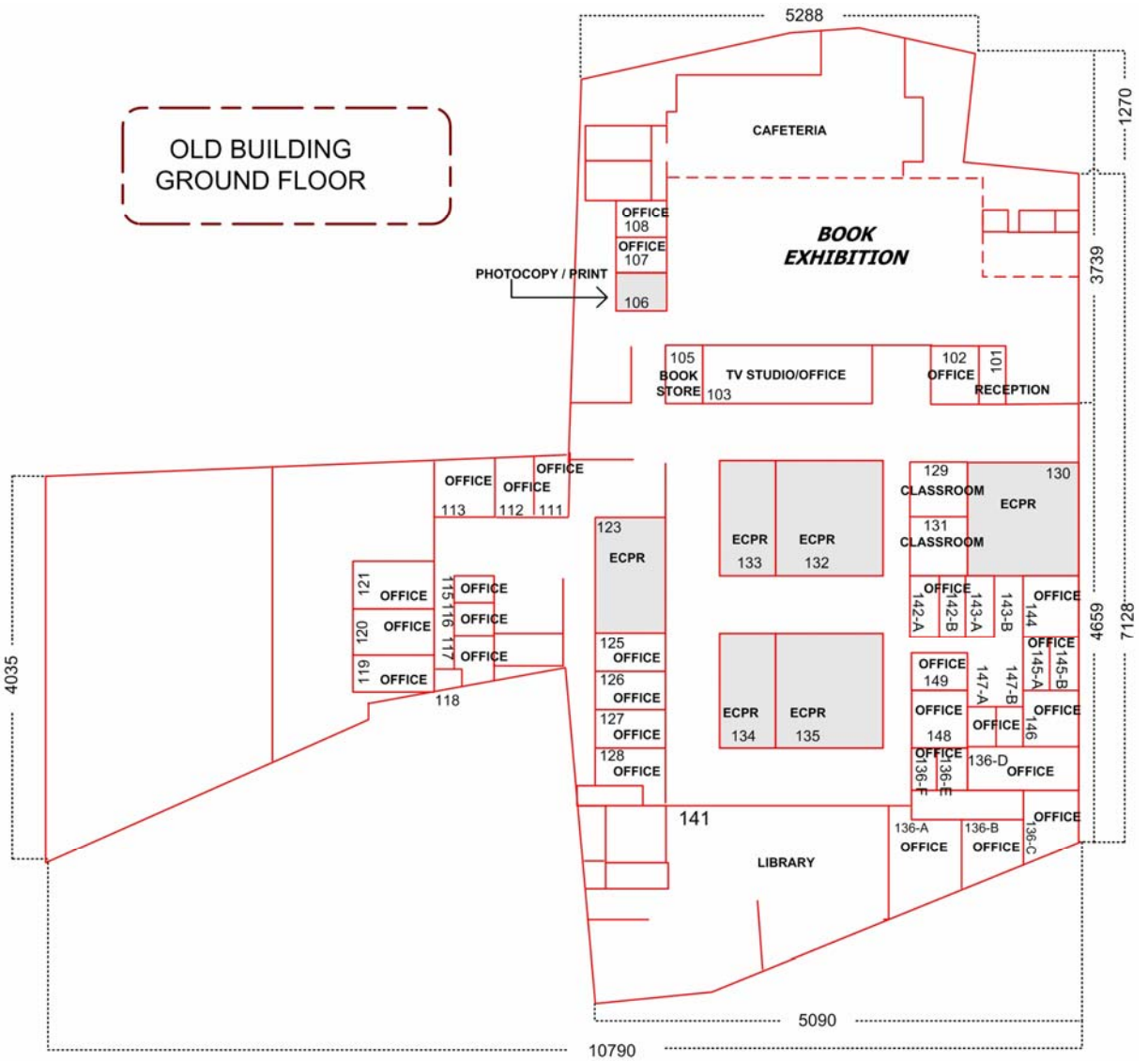
