**ERIK JONES** is Director of European Studies at the Paul H. Nitze School of Advanced International Studies and Director of the Bologna Institute for Policy Research of the Johns Hopkins University. He is also Head of Europe at Oxford Analytica. In addition, Professor Jones is a Senior Research Fellow at Nuffield College in Oxford, United Kingdom. Jones is author of *The Politics of Economic and Monetary Union* (2002), *Economic Adjustment and Political Transformation in Small States* (2008), and, together with Dana Allin, *Weary Policeman: American Power in an Age of Austerity* (2012). He is editor or co-editor of more than twenty books or special issues of journals on topics related to European politics and political economy including *The Oxford Handbook of the European Union* (2012). Professor Jones teaches on topics in international and comparative political economy with a particular focus on Europe and the transatlantic relationship.

Professor Jones is a frequent commentator on European politics and political economy whose contributions have been published in, among others, the Baltimore Sun, Boston Globe, Financial Times, International Herald Tribune, Philadelphia Inquirer, USA Today, and newspapers and magazines across Europe. He is also a regular columnist with *E!Sharp*. He has written extensively on European monetary integration and macroeconomic governance and has been active in public debates about the European response to the global economic and financial crisis.

Professor Jones is a contributing editor to the Institute for International and Strategic Studies journal *Survival* and sits on the editorial boards for *The International Spectator*, the *Journal of European Public Policy*, *Government and Opposition*, and the *Journal of European Integration*. He also serves on management committee for the Istituto Carlo Cattaneo and the steering committee for the Standing Group on the European Union of the European Consortium for Political Research. He has also worked closely with think tanks in Brussels, The Hague, London, Madrid, Milan and Rome. Jones is a frequent contributor to Oxford Analytica and an occasional contributor to the Gerson Lehrman Group. He advises two innovative start-up consultancies: Counterpoint and Oxfirst, focused on 'cultural intelligence' and the economic aspects of innovation, respectively. He has worked closely with both the European Commission and the European Parliament.

Jones earned his AB at Princeton University (1988) and his MA and PhD at Johns Hopkins SAIS (1990, 1996). Prior to joining the faculty at Johns Hopkins, he worked at the Centre for European Policy Studies, the Central European University and the University of Nottingham. A US citizen, Jones has lived in Europe for the last twenty years; he is married with three children.
